Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ: Christians have always observed with great devotion the days of our Lord's passion and resurrection. We invite you to join us for special Lent & Holy Week services: Community Lenten Services each week at 5:30 pm, check the church bulletin for exact schedule.


